Superstitions abound about Friday the 13th and there are good folks that won't even get out of bed today for fear of a bad experience. Flying, driving or even walking across the street is too much for their emotions to contemplate. Fear is a powerful motivator or paralyzer that can make a big difference in a person's life.

Understanding the importance of emotions in our decision-making has never been easy. Denial by some rationalists of any role for emotion in human decision-making has left a gap among some psychologists and philosophers that may be a cognitive black hole. Get too close and the arguments could suck you into a space where knowledge is as thin as October ice.

Daniel Goleman has written creatively, critically and brilliantly about emotional intelligence. He makes a cogent case about the importance of understanding the important role of emotion in the totality of who humans are and what humans do. Long before Goleman, **Charles Darwin** recognized the ability of human and non-human animals to communicate emotional states of anger, rage, and fear through facial expression. Recognition of these behavioral signals was naturally favored as an ability and contributed to survival. A genetic predisposition to recognize and react appropriately through a fight or flight response became locked into our ancestor's nervous systems.

Recognition of nuances of emotion that emerge through language contributes to our interpersonal intelligence. Some among us are blessed with a talent for reading the signals expressed by others through the way words are used to convey much more than the literal meaning of how words are assembled into sentences. Confidence, sincerity, cowardice or subterfuge may emerge in the mind of the listener from subtle tone of voice or silence of barely perceptible hesitation. The reading of these signals may be right or wrong, revealing or misleading. Knowing, in a non-rational way, the difference is a powerful part of interpersonal intelligence.

We have a lot to learn about our emotions. Perhaps unfortunately, certainly inevitably, our scholarly tools are logical, rational, linguistic.

But superstitions aside, attempts to understand reactions to the juxtaposition of the reputation for unlucky Fridays and the fearful perceptions attached to the number 13 are certainly curious. The slogan TGIF (the one larger than this eRag) has a fairly recent origin. Years back executions were done exclusively on Fridays and, of course, the crucifixion that kick-started Christianity was on Friday. Today, after all, is just another day. Take a pill and chill. Word has it the weather will improve and Saturday will start a summer we can all begin to enjoy. Delta and American Airlines predict from historical data that their seats will be just as full today as any other day.
